- The SDU-UK Academic Office met with Professor Alzain Karrar and Dr Alkhatim Alyass, of the Sudan Medical Council in January 2018 in Khartoum.
- Discussions focused on doctors' training needs and how best the SDU-UK Academic Office can provide their support.
- Training needs identified were: Training the Trainer, Leadership, Safety
 Quality Improvement, and Clinical Governance.
- The Sudan Medical Council are keen to have biannual training events. We plan to hold our first training event in the 2nd week of August.

UK Medical Specialities

- The SDU-UK Academic Office has corresponded with all the individual Medical Royal Colleges early this year. We highlighted our keen interest to build on the long-term relationships with the Colleges, in the training and support of Sudanese doctors, both here in the UK and in the Sudan.
- We expressed our wishes to explore future training opportunities and joint working to improve the quality of health service provision in Sudan. The training of doctors and allied healthcare staff is an integral part of this process.
- We are pleased with the positive responses we have received from The Royal College of Emergency Medicine through their International Officer, Victoria De Witt, as well as The Royal College of Anaesthetists through Maria Burke, their Global Partnership Manager.
- Furthermore, we are delighted to announce that the Pathology Specialist Diaspora Group have signed a Memorandum of Understanding with the Royal College of Pathologists, the Khartoum Ministry of Health and SOBA University Hospital to tackle antibiotic resistance in Sudan. We would like to commend the hard work done by Dr Hussam El-mugamar & Dr Afaf Elhag in progressing this achievement.



Royal College

- The Academic Office, has in response to communication from the Royal College of Anaesthetists, liaised with Dr Awatif Mohammed from the Sudanese Society of Anaesthesiologists. She identified the high mortality rates in maternal and paediatric anaesthetic intervention and the need to develop Anaesthetic sub-Specialities Training in Sudan.
- Unfortunately, we have not been successful in getting a response from the Academy of Medical Royal Colleges (AoMRC), despite repeatedly writing to the president of the Academy, Mr Henderson.
- Members may remember that a Memorandum of Understanding was signed in 2014 between the SDU-UK, the AoMRC and Sudan Specialisation Board.



- The Academic Office remains keen to engage with the BESAM group and is hopeful to expand on the work it had initiated.
- It is clear that the individual Colleges through their international departments welcome initiatives to engage in collaborative work with their members.

We would like to urge the Medical Specialities' Groups in the SDU-UK to engage with their members in the UK & colleagues from Sudan to progress these initiatives for the benefit of health care training and provision in Sudan

Sudanese Diaspora Community:

- The Academic office joined the University of Khartoum International Women Day event early this month and received requests for health awareness talks on Addiction and Sexual Health.
- We will liaise with the Sudanese Community Centre with regards to organising dates for future events.
